***Castro names civic-minded Yonkers man Campaign Manager
30-year member of Democratic Party gets nod to head Castro effort***

Tony Castro, a candidate for District Attorney in the September 15th Democratic Primary Election, today appointed Steven Iallonardo of Yonkers as his campaign manager.

"Steve is a 30-year member of the Democratic Party and has served as a Democratic district leader in Yonkers since 1980," Castro said. "Like me, he has a long-standing appreciation for traditional Democratic values of fairness and justice and equal treatment under the law."

Iallonardo is a state-certified school psychologist with the New York City Department of Education.
